
#### **Public Capital Fund Campaign Kicks Off**


# Battle For the Ages!



*When I heard these things, I sat down and* wept. For some days I mourned and fasted and prayed before the God of heaven." Nehemiah 1:4

everything seems to be falling apart? A day where you are anything like me; you too often respond with is negative. A day when even your dog wants to hide thoroughly praying through the situation or struggle. from you. I think that is the kind of day Nehemiah How much better would I deal with things if only I was having as we read the words of Nehemiah 1:1-3. would talk to God first? He hears a report of the "Jewish remnant" and it is anything but positive or encouraging. And that is response. In verse 4 Nehemiah reacts and does five example and follow him in dealing with life. things that set an example for us as we face difficult news or situations in our lives.

First, he sits down. That is correct Nehemiah realized his humanness and took a seat. Sometimes we just need to accept that we are weak and frail and take a seat. Sometimes we just need to rest ourselves as we face difficulties or crisis. Often I am not willing to admit my physical limitations and I try to push through the situation. And this usually turns out with me making myself physically ill and then I rest. So like Nehemiah, we need to recognize our limitations and physical needs and act upon them.

Second, he wept. Nehemiah was broken over the report of the pain of his fellow Jews and he did not hide his emotions. It is good for us to openly express our emotions. It is ok for us to cry when struggles arise.

Third, he mourned. Nehemiah's pain was more than a brief ache. His pain overwhelmed him to the point of mourning. He knew sorrow and he did not hide from it. Sometimes we need to except the hurt

that is real in our lives.


Fourth, he fasted. Nehemiah did not wallow in his pain. Instead he began to act on it. He prioritizes the situations and makes it an item that will drive him to search for God's will in it. There comes a time when we need to set aside things of this life that distract us from knowing God's purpose and plan and seek His face. Maybe it is time to give up Monday night football or another sitcom and listen for the Holy Spirit to speak.

Fifth, he prays. Nehemiah doesn't make a plan or Have you ever had one of those days when overreact - he prays before the God of heaven. If everything you touch breaks and every report you get action (sometimes aggression) before stopping to

If your life never has difficulties or bad news, then ignore everything you just read. But if your life is like where we pick up verse 4 and Nehemiah's life at camp... we need to look closely at Nehemiah's
